Associate Professor Richard Oloruntoba

Dr Richard Oloruntoba is the Supply Chain Management Discipline Lead and Associate Professor of Supply Chain Management at Curtin Business School. Richard worked in a range of logistics, freight forwarding, and transport management roles for 13 years in West Africa, and the United Kingdom before beginning an academic career in logistics and supply chain management in 2001 at the Centre for International Shipping & International Logistics, University of Plymouth, United Kingdom. He has been External Examiner at Universities in Europe, India and Australia, and Visiting Professor at research intensive public universities in USA. Richard is the current Regional Editor (Australasia) for the *International Journal of Physical Distribution and Logistics Management*, and a member of the editorial advisory boards of *Journal of Business Logistics*, and the *Journal of Humanitarian Logistics and Supply Chain Management*. He is a Global Research Fellow at the Watson Institute for International and Public Affairs at Brown University, USA.
